



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Birmingham-Hoover (MSA) [13820]**

Birmingham-Hoover is one of 363 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) in the nation. Its 2000 population of 1,053,405 ranked 48th in the nation.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Birmingham-Hoover had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$28,382. This PCPI ranked 113th in the United States and was 95 percent of the national average, \$29,845. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.1 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Birmingham-Hoover was \$18,024 and ranked 129th in the United States. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Birmingham-Hoover had a total personal income (TPI) of \$29,898,091\*. This TPI ranked 49th in the United States. In 1990 the TPI of Birmingham-Hoover was \$17,279,844\* and ranked 49th in the United States. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 6.7 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Birmingham-Hoover. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 68.2 percent of TPI (compared with 67.7 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 18.0 percent (compared with 19.0 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 13.8 percent (compared with 13.3 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 6.2 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 8.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.5 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 5.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.0 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Birmingham-Hoover increased from \$21,933,882\* in 1999 to \$23,234,425\* in 2000, an increase of 5.9 percent. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$13,340,030\* to the 2000 estimate was 5.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.
