



## **BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001**

### **Burlington-South Burlington (MSA) [15540]**

Burlington-South Burlington is one of 363 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) in the nation. Its 2001 population of 201,089 ranked 194th in the nation.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Burlington-South Burlington had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$31,443. This PCPI ranked 61st in the United States and was 103 percent of the national average, \$30,574. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.1 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 2.4 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Burlington-South Burlington was \$19,637 and ranked 89th in the United States. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Burlington-South Burlington had a total personal income (TPI) of \$6,322,801\*. This TPI ranked 172nd in the United States. In 1991 the TPI of Burlington-South Burlington was \$3,523,814\* and ranked 178th in the United States. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 4.9 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Burlington-South Burlington. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 71.4 percent of TPI (compared with 71.8 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.3 percent (compared with 18.1 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 11.3 percent (compared with 10.2 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 4.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 2.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 9.9 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 6.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.2 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Burlington-South Burlington increased from \$5,116,757\* in 2000 to \$5,372,140\* in 2001, an increase of 5.0 percent. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$2,995,888\* to the 2001 estimate was 6.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.
