



## **BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001 Greenville (BEA-EA) [57067]**

Greenville is one of 179 BEA Economic Areas in the nation. Its 2001 population of 624,171 ranked 97th in the nation.

### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Greenville had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$24,184. This PCPI ranked 123rd in the United States and was 79 percent of the national average, \$30,574. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.1 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 2.4 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Greenville was \$15,290 and ranked 148th in the United States. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Greenville had a total personal income (TPI) of \$15,094,988\*. This TPI ranked 101st in the United States. In 1991 the TPI of Greenville was \$8,811,684\* and ranked 98th in the United States. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 2.5 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Greenville. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 64.7 percent of TPI (compared with 68.6 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.9 percent (compared with 17.5 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 17.4 percent (compared with 14.0 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 1.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 0.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 9.9 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 4.9 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.9 percent.

### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Greenville increased from \$10,597,524\* in 2000 to \$10,703,595\* in 2001, an increase of 1.0 percent. The 2000-2001 national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$6,628,996\* to the 2001 estimate was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.
