



## **BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002 Glacier , Montana [30035]**

Glacier is one of 56 counties in Montana. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2002 population of 13,169 ranked 13th in the state.

### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2002 Glacier had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$18,203. This PCPI ranked 48th in the state and was 73 percent of the state average, \$25,068, and 59 percent of the national average, \$30,821. The 2002 PCPI reflected an increase of 1.6 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 1.6 percent and the national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Glacier was \$12,757 and ranked 55th in the state. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2002 Glacier had a total personal income (TPI) of \$239,709\*. This TPI ranked 17th in the state and accounted for 1.1 percent of the state total. In 1992 the TPI of Glacier was \$157,338\* and ranked 18th in the state. The 2002 TPI reflected an increase of 1.8 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.1 percent and the national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Glacier. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 57.5 percent of TPI (compared with 61.8 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.7 percent (compared with 17.2 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 27.8 percent (compared with 20.9 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings increased 0.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 4.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.2 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 3.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.3 percent.

### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Glacier increased from \$166,102\* in 2001 to \$168,269\* in 2002, an increase of 1.3 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.5 percent and the national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$121,150\* to the 2002 estimate was 3.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
