



BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002 Stanton , Nebraska [31167]

Stanton is one of 93 counties in Nebraska. It is part of the Norfolk, NE Micropolitan SA. Its 2002 population of 6,492 ranked 47th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Stanton had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$20,950. This PCPI ranked 69th in the state and was 72 percent of the state average, \$29,203, and 68 percent of the national average, \$30,821. The 2002 PCPI reflected a decrease of 6.6 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 1.8 percent and the national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Stanton was \$17,314 and ranked 49th in the state. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 1.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Stanton had a total personal income (TPI) of \$136,010*. This TPI ranked 53rd in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1992 the TPI of Stanton was \$108,336* and ranked 51st in the state. The 2002 TPI reflected a decrease of 5.3 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.2 percent and the national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Stanton. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 75.0 percent of TPI (compared with 75.5 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 10.7 percent (compared with 15.6 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 14.3 percent (compared with 8.9 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings decreased 6.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 8.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 7.3 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 2.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 1.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Stanton decreased from \$84,358* in 2001 to \$72,736* in 2002, a decrease of 13.8 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.2 percent and the national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$78,586* to the 2002 estimate was - 0.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
