



## **BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002**

### **Santa Fe , New Mexico [35049]**

Santa Fe is one of 33 counties in New Mexico. It is part of the [Santa Fe, NM \(MSA\)](#). Its 2002 population of 134,563 ranked 3rd in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2002 Santa Fe had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$32,320. This PCPI ranked 2nd in the state and was 133 percent of the state average, \$24,310, and 105 percent of the national average, \$30,821. The 2002 PCPI reflected an increase of 0.8 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 0.7 percent and the national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Santa Fe was \$20,953 and ranked 2nd in the state. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.1 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2002 Santa Fe had a total personal income (TPI) of \$4,349,092<sup>\*</sup>. This TPI ranked 2nd in the state and accounted for 9.7 percent of the state total. In 1992 the TPI of Santa Fe was \$2,221,689<sup>\*</sup> and ranked 2nd in the state. The 2002 TPI reflected an increase of 3.1 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 1.9 percent and the national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.7 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Santa Fe. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 65.7 percent of TPI (compared with 65.1 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 23.5 percent (compared with 25.9 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 10.9 percent (compared with 9.0 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings increased 8.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 11.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.3 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 7.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 9.0 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Santa Fe increased from \$2,720,758<sup>\*</sup> in 2001 to \$2,942,172<sup>\*</sup> in 2002, an increase of 8.1 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was 3.7 percent and the national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$1,465,824<sup>\*</sup> to the 2002 estimate was 7.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
