



BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002 Oklahoma , Oklahoma [40109]

Oklahoma is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is part of the [Oklahoma City, OK \(MSA\)](#). Its 2002 population of 672,875 ranked 1st in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Oklahoma had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$30,212. This PCPI ranked 2nd in the state and was 117 percent of the state average, \$25,872, and 98 percent of the national average, \$30,821. The 2002 PCPI reflected a decrease of 1.2 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was -0.6 percent and the national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Oklahoma was \$19,824 and ranked 4th in the state. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.1 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Oklahoma had a total personal income (TPI) of \$20,328,763*. This TPI ranked 1st in the state and accounted for 22.5 percent of the state total. In 1992 the TPI of Oklahoma was \$12,196,277* and ranked 1st in the state. The 2002 TPI reflected a decrease of 0.2 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change remained unchanged and the national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Oklahoma. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 68.8 percent of TPI (compared with 67.8 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.6 percent (compared with 19.0 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 13.6 percent (compared with 13.2 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings decreased 0.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 2.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts decreased 2.1 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 5.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.6 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Oklahoma increased from \$20,244,278* in 2001 to \$20,492,886* in 2002, an increase of 1.2 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was - 0.3 percent and the national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$12,168,979* to the 2002 estimate was 5.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
