



BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002 Wheeler , Oregon [41069]

Wheeler is one of 36 counties in Oregon. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2002 population of 1,524 ranked 36th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Wheeler had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$19,657. This PCPI ranked 33rd in the state and was 68 percent of the state average, \$28,931, and 64 percent of the national average, \$30,821. The 2002 PCPI reflected a decrease of 4.5 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 1.4 percent and the national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Wheeler was \$14,277 and ranked 35th in the state. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Wheeler had a total personal income (TPI) of \$29,958*. This TPI ranked 36th in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1992 the TPI of Wheeler was \$20,530* and ranked 36th in the state. The 2002 TPI reflected a decrease of 2.7 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.9 percent and the national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.9 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Wheeler. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 34.8 percent of TPI (compared with 32.2 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 38.5 percent (compared with 44.9 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 26.7 percent (compared with 22.8 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings decreased 2.7 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 7.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.9 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 4.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.5 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Wheeler decreased from \$8,852* in 2001 to \$8,546* in 2002, a decrease of 3.5 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was 3.1 percent and the national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$6,659* to the 2002 estimate was 2.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.1 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
