



## **BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002**

### **Northumberland , Virginia [51133]**

Northumberland is one of 105 counties in Virginia. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2002 population of 12,595 ranked 88th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2002 Northumberland had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$27,016. This PCPI ranked 36th in the state and was 82 percent of the state average, \$33,033, and 88 percent of the national average, \$30,821. The 2002 PCPI reflected an increase of 1.0 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 1.6 percent and the national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Northumberland was \$17,987 and ranked 37th in the state. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2002 Northumberland had a total personal income (TPI) of \$340,263\*. This TPI ranked 78th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1992 the TPI of Northumberland was \$198,667\* and ranked 82nd in the state. The 2002 TPI reflected an increase of 3.2 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.9 percent and the national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Northumberland. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 40.1 percent of TPI (compared with 44.5 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 38.3 percent (compared with 35.7 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 21.6 percent (compared with 19.9 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings increased 1.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 3.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.8 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 4.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 6.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.4 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Northumberland decreased from \$93,283\* in 2001 to \$92,395\* in 2002, a decrease of 1.0 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was 2.7 percent and the national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$75,070\* to the 2002 estimate was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.9 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
