



BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002

Colorado Springs (BEA-EA) [57036]

Colorado Springs is one of 179 BEA Economic Areas in the nation. Its 2002 population of 633,368 ranked 96th in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Colorado Springs had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$28,766. This PCPI ranked 44th in the United States and was 93 percent of the national average, \$30,821. The 2002 PCPI reflected a decrease of 0.9 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Colorado Springs was \$18,780 and ranked 59th in the United States. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Colorado Springs had a total personal income (TPI) of \$18,219,307*. This TPI ranked 92nd in the United States. In 1992 the TPI of Colorado Springs was \$9,133,222* and ranked 104th in the United States. The 2002 TPI reflected an increase of 0.8 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 7.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Colorado Springs. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 71.8 percent of TPI (compared with 70.1 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 16.6 percent (compared with 18.5 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 11.6 percent (compared with 11.3 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings increased 0.7 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 6.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 13.3 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 7.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 6.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.4 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Colorado Springs increased from \$14,143,547* in 2001 to \$14,308,529* in 2002, an increase of 1.2 percent. The 2001-2002 national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$7,010,505* to the 2002 estimate was 7.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.4 percent.
