



## **BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002**

### **Fort Wayne-Huntington-Auburn (BEA-EA) [57060]**

Fort Wayne-Huntington-Auburn is one of 179 BEA Economic Areas in the nation. Its 2002 population of 776,977 ranked 84th in the nation.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2002 Fort Wayne-Huntington-Auburn had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$26,612. This PCPI ranked 77th in the United States and was 86 percent of the national average, \$30,821. The 2002 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.2 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Fort Wayne-Huntington-Auburn was \$18,904 and ranked 57th in the United States. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.0 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2002 Fort Wayne-Huntington-Auburn had a total personal income (TPI) of \$20,677,076\*. This TPI ranked 79th in the United States. In 1992 the TPI of Fort Wayne-Huntington-Auburn was \$13,628,876\* and ranked 77th in the United States. The 2002 TPI reflected an increase of 2.5 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.2 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Fort Wayne-Huntington-Auburn. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 68.4 percent of TPI (compared with 68.3 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 16.6 percent (compared with 18.0 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 15.0 percent (compared with 13.7 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings increased 3.1 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 3.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.2 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 4.3 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.2 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Fort Wayne-Huntington-Auburn increased from \$15,551,789\* in 2001 to \$16,030,925\* in 2002, an increase of 3.1 percent. The 2001-2002 national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$10,589,782\* to the 2002 estimate was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.4 percent.
