



BEARFACTS 1993 – 2003

Clay , Indiana [18021]

Clay is one of 92 counties in Indiana. It is part of the [Terre Haute, IN \(MSA\)](#). Its 2003 population of 26,641 ranked 60th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 Clay had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$22,906. This PCPI ranked 80th in the state and was 79 percent of the state average, \$28,891, and 73 percent of the national average, \$31,504. The 2003 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.4 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 3.0 percent and the national change was 2.2 percent. In 1993 the PCPI of Clay was \$16,651 and ranked 70th in the state. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 3.9 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 Clay had a total personal income (TPI) of \$610,245*. This TPI ranked 63rd in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1993 the TPI of Clay was \$425,498* and ranked 62nd in the state. The 2003 TPI reflected an increase of 5.4 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 3.6 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 5.1 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Clay. In 2003 net earnings accounted for 66.3 percent of TPI (compared with 64.2 in 1993); dividends, interest, and rent were 12.8 percent (compared with 16.3 in 1993); and personal current transfer receipts were 20.9 percent (compared with 19.5 in 1993). From 2002 to 2003 net earnings increased 9.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 10.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 3.6 percent. From 1993 to 2003 net earnings increased on average 4.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.4 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Clay increased from \$266,454* in 2002 to \$307,575* in 2003, an increase of 15.4 percent. The 2002-2003 state change was 5.1 percent and the national change was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1993 estimate of \$228,330* to the 2003 estimate was 3.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.
