



## **BEARFACTS 1993 – 2003**

### **Linn , Kansas [20107]**

Linn is one of 105 counties in Kansas. It is part of the [Kansas City, MO-KS \(MSA\)](#). Its 2003 population of 9,682 ranked 44th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2003 Linn had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$23,203. This PCPI ranked 83rd in the state and was 78 percent of the state average, \$29,802, and 74 percent of the national average, \$31,504. The 2003 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.7 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 2.8 percent and the national change was 2.2 percent. In 1993 the PCPI of Linn was \$16,437 and ranked 78th in the state. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 3.9 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2003 Linn had a total personal income (TPI) of \$224,654\*. This TPI ranked 45th in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1993 the TPI of Linn was \$139,751\* and ranked 52nd in the state. The 2003 TPI reflected an increase of 4.7 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 3.2 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 5.1 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Linn. In 2003 net earnings accounted for 61.4 percent of TPI (compared with 56.6 in 1993); dividends, interest, and rent were 16.0 percent (compared with 20.9 in 1993); and personal current transfer receipts were 22.7 percent (compared with 22.5 in 1993). From 2002 to 2003 net earnings increased 7.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 6.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.5 percent. From 1993 to 2003 net earnings increased on average 5.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.0 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Linn increased from \$80,278\* in 2002 to \$90,237\* in 2003, an increase of 12.4 percent. The 2002-2003 state change was 5.0 percent and the national change was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1993 estimate of \$64,823\* to the 2003 estimate was 3.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.
