



BEARFACTS 1993 – 2003

Bowman , North Dakota [38011]

Bowman is one of 53 counties in North Dakota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2003 population of 3,039 ranked 36th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 Bowman had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$29,683. This PCPI ranked 19th in the state and was 103 percent of the state average, \$28,712, and 94 percent of the national average, \$31,504. The 2003 PCPI reflected an increase of 28.7 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 8.7 percent and the national change was 2.2 percent. In 1993 the PCPI of Bowman was \$20,233 and ranked 1st in the state. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 Bowman had a total personal income (TPI) of \$90,206*. This TPI ranked 34th in the state and accounted for 0.5 percent of the state total. In 1993 the TPI of Bowman was \$67,721* and ranked 31st in the state. The 2003 TPI reflected an increase of 28.2 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 8.6 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.1 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Bowman. In 2003 net earnings accounted for 58.5 percent of TPI (compared with 55.1 in 1993); dividends, interest, and rent were 24.0 percent (compared with 27.5 in 1993); and personal current transfer receipts were 17.5 percent (compared with 17.4 in 1993). From 2002 to 2003 net earnings increased 57.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 0.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 3.4 percent. From 1993 to 2003 net earnings increased on average 3.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 2.9 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Bowman increased from \$40,131* in 2002 to \$60,533* in 2003, an increase of 50.8 percent. The 2002-2003 state change was 12.2 percent and the national change was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1993 estimate of \$43,000* to the 2003 estimate was 3.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.3 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.
