



BEARFACTS 1993 – 2003

Iowa , Wisconsin [55049]

Iowa is one of 72 counties in Wisconsin. It is part of the [Madison, WI \(MSA\)](#). Its 2003 population of 23,151 ranked 48th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 Iowa had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$27,854. This PCPI ranked 29th in the state and was 91 percent of the state average, \$30,705, and 88 percent of the national average, \$31,504. The 2003 PCPI reflected a decrease of 3.1 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 2.4 percent and the national change was 2.2 percent. In 1993 the PCPI of Iowa was \$16,596 and ranked 38th in the state. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 Iowa had a total personal income (TPI) of \$644,849*. This TPI ranked 45th in the state and accounted for 0.4 percent of the state total. In 1993 the TPI of Iowa was \$348,514* and ranked 48th in the state. The 2003 TPI reflected a decrease of 2.5 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 state change was 2.9 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 5.1 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Iowa. In 2003 net earnings accounted for 74.6 percent of TPI (compared with 67.7 in 1993); dividends, interest, and rent were 13.2 percent (compared with 18.9 in 1993); and personal current transfer receipts were 12.3 percent (compared with 13.4 in 1993). From 2002 to 2003 net earnings decreased 1.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 12.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 3.2 percent. From 1993 to 2003 net earnings increased on average 7.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.4 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Iowa decreased from \$540,921* in 2002 to \$483,665* in 2003, a decrease of 10.6 percent. The 2002-2003 state change was 4.3 percent and the national change was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1993 estimate of \$234,359* to the 2003 estimate was 7.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.
