



BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004

Butler , Iowa [19023]

Butler is one of 99 counties in Iowa. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2004 population of 14,798 ranked 53rd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Butler had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$27,776. This PCPI ranked 58th in the state and was 90 percent of the state average, \$30,698, and 84 percent of the national average, \$33,123. The 2004 PCPI reflected an increase of 14.4 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 7.4 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. In 1994 the PCPI of Butler was \$18,484 and ranked 63rd in the state. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.1 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Butler had a total personal income (TPI) of \$411,035*. This TPI ranked 57th in the state and accounted for 0.5 percent of the state total. In 1994 the TPI of Butler was \$287,936* and ranked 54th in the state. The 2004 TPI reflected an increase of 14.4 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 7.8 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Butler. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 66.2 percent of TPI (compared with 60.5 in 1994); dividends, interest, and rent were 15.5 percent (compared with 21.3 in 1994); and personal current transfer receipts were 18.3 percent (compared with 18.2 in 1994). From 2003 to 2004 net earnings increased 22.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 1.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 3.3 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings increased on average 4.6 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 0.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Butler increased from \$135,343* in 2003 to \$176,992* in 2004, an increase of 30.8 percent. The 2003-2004 state change was 9.6 percent and the national change was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1994 estimate of \$124,181* to the 2004 estimate was 3.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
