



## **BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004**

### **Burt , Nebraska [31021]**

Burt is one of 93 counties in Nebraska. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2004 population of 7,402 ranked 41st in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2004 Burt had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,875. This PCPI ranked 57th in the state and was 81 percent of the state average, \$31,781, and 78 percent of the national average, \$33,123. The 2004 PCPI reflected a decrease of 3.0 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 3.3 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. In 1994 the PCPI of Burt was \$18,410 and ranked 42nd in the state. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 4.1 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2004 Burt had a total personal income (TPI) of \$191,529\*. This TPI ranked 42nd in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1994 the TPI of Burt was \$143,285\* and ranked 44th in the state. The 2004 TPI reflected a decrease of 2.5 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 3.8 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Burt. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 60.7 percent of TPI (compared with 58.3 in 1994); dividends, interest, and rent were 15.5 percent (compared with 22.0 in 1994); and personal current transfer receipts were 23.8 percent (compared with 19.7 in 1994). From 2003 to 2004 net earnings increased 0.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 21.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.4 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings increased on average 3.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 0.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.9 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Burt decreased from \$79,520\* in 2003 to \$77,458\* in 2004, a decrease of 2.6 percent. The 2003-2004 state change was 5.2 percent and the national change was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1994 estimate of \$72,463\* to the 2004 estimate was 0.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
