



BEARFACTS 1994 – 2004

Tyler , Texas [48457]

Tyler is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2004 population of 20,505 ranked 111th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Tyler had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$20,823. This PCPI ranked 207th in the state and was 67 percent of the state average, \$30,948, and 63 percent of the national average, \$33,123. The 2004 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.6 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 5.3 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. In 1994 the PCPI of Tyler was \$14,705 and ranked 201st in the state. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 4.1 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2004 Tyler had a total personal income (TPI) of \$426,967*. This TPI ranked 124th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1994 the TPI of Tyler was \$281,934* and ranked 120th in the state. The 2004 TPI reflected an increase of 3.0 percent from 2003. The 2003-2004 state change was 7.0 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. The 1994-2004 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.4 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Tyler. In 2004 net earnings accounted for 59.9 percent of TPI (compared with 58.5 in 1994); dividends, interest, and rent were 11.6 percent (compared with 15.7 in 1994); and personal current transfer receipts were 28.5 percent (compared with 25.8 in 1994). From 2003 to 2004 net earnings increased 5.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 10.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 3.1 percent. From 1994 to 2004 net earnings increased on average 4.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Tyler increased from \$153,383* in 2003 to \$159,115* in 2004, an increase of 3.7 percent. The 2003-2004 state change was 7.9 percent and the national change was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1994 estimate of \$110,898* to the 2004 estimate was 3.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.8 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
