



## **BEARFACTS 1995 – 2005**

### **Lyon , Kansas [20111]**

Lyon is one of 105 counties in Kansas. It is part of the Emporia, KS Micropolitan SA. Its 2005 population of 35,881 ranked 13th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Lyon had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$23,719. This PCPI ranked 89th in the state and was 73 percent of the state average, \$32,709, and 68 percent of the national average, \$34,757. The 2005 PCPI reflected an increase of 3.4 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 5.5 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 1995 the PCPI of Lyon was \$17,186 and ranked 76th in the state. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.3 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Lyon had a total personal income (TPI) of \$851,052\*. This TPI ranked 20th in the state and accounted for 0.9 percent of the state total. In 1995 the TPI of Lyon was \$613,056\* and ranked 16th in the state. The 2005 TPI reflected an increase of 3.1 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 5.9 percent and the national change was 5.9 percent. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Lyon. In 2005 net earnings accounted for 65.5 percent of TPI (compared with 65.7 in 1995); dividends, interest, and rent were 16.1 percent (compared with 18.6 in 1995); and personal current transfer receipts were 18.4 percent (compared with 15.6 in 1995). From 2004 to 2005 net earnings increased 0.2 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 12.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.2 percent. From 1995 to 2005 net earnings increased on average 3.3 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.0 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Lyon decreased from \$660,541\* in 2004 to \$658,978\* in 2005, a decrease of 0.2 percent. The 2004-2005 state change was 4.6 percent and the national change was 5.4 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1995 estimate of \$475,549\* to the 2005 estimate was 3.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

*\*Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
