



BEARFACTS 1996 – 2006 Steele , North Dakota [38091]

Steele is one of 53 counties in North Dakota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2006 population of 1,908 ranked 48th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2006 Steele had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$29,503. This PCPI ranked 28th in the state and was 90 percent of the state average, \$32,763, and 80 percent of the national average, \$36,714. The 2006 PCPI reflected an increase of 1.7 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 state change was 2.8 percent and the national change was 5.6 percent. In 1996 the PCPI of Steele was \$23,733 and ranked 9th in the state. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 4.3 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2006 Steele had a total personal income (TPI) of \$56,291*. This TPI ranked 49th in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1996 the TPI of Steele was \$54,966* and ranked 41st in the state. The 2006 TPI reflected a decrease of 1.6 percent from 2005. The 2005-2006 state change was 3.0 percent and the national change was 6.7 percent. The 1996-2006 average annual growth rate of TPI was 0.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.3 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Steele. In 2006 net earnings accounted for 54.5 percent of TPI (compared with 62.0 in 1996); dividends, interest, and rent were 26.4 percent (compared with 24.0 in 1996); and personal current transfer receipts were 19.1 percent (compared with 14.0 in 1996). From 2005 to 2006 net earnings decreased 8.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 7.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.1 percent. From 1996 to 2006 net earnings decreased on average 1.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.4 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Steele decreased from \$33,577* in 2005 to \$30,641* in 2006, a decrease of 8.7 percent. The 2005-2006 state change was 2.0 percent and the national change was 5.7 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1996 estimate of \$34,223* to the 2006 estimate was - 1.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
