



State BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002 New York

The population of New York in 2002 was 19,132,542. Its rank was 3rd in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 New York had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$35,416. This PCPI ranked 5th in the United States and was 115 percent of the national average, \$30,821. The 2002 PCPI reflected a decrease of 0.6 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of New York was \$24,867 and ranked 3rd in the United States. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 New York had a total personal income (TPI) of \$677,604,314*. This TPI ranked 2nd in the United States. In 1992 the TPI of New York was \$453,736,621* and ranked 2nd in the United States. The 2002 TPI reflected a decrease of 0.3 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and total personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of New York. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 67.5 percent of TPI (compared with 65.6 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 15.2 percent (compared with 18.4 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 17.3 percent (compared with 15.9 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings increased 0.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 9.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.2 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 4.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.9 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in New York decreased from \$551,150,736* in 2001 to \$549,508,009* in 2002, a decrease of 0.3 percent. The 2001-2002 national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$355,601,603* to the 2002 estimate was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.4 percent.
