



State BEARFACTS 1993 – 2003

North Dakota

The population of North Dakota in 2003 was 633,159. Its rank was 48th in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 North Dakota had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$28,712. This PCPI ranked 33rd in the United States and was 91 percent of the national average, \$31,504. The 2003 PCPI reflected an increase of 8.7 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 national change was 2.2 percent. In 1993 the PCPI of North Dakota was \$17,703 and ranked 42nd in the United States. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2003 North Dakota had a total personal income (TPI) of \$18,179,042*. This TPI ranked 49th in the United States. In 1993 the TPI of North Dakota was \$11,351,398* and ranked 48th in the United States. The 2003 TPI reflected an increase of 8.6 percent from 2002. The 2002-2003 national change was 3.1 percent. The 1993-2003 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.1 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and total personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of North Dakota. In 2003 net earnings accounted for 67.5 percent of TPI (compared with 64.0 in 1993); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.3 percent (compared with 19.7 in 1993); and personal current transfer receipts were 15.2 percent (compared with 16.3 in 1993). From 2002 to 2003 net earnings increased 13.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 3.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 3.4 percent. From 1993 to 2003 net earnings increased on average 5.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.1 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in North Dakota increased from \$12,897,821* in 2002 to \$14,475,548* in 2003, an increase of 12.2 percent. The 2002-2003 national change was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1993 estimate of \$8,635,142* to the 2003 estimate was 5.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.3 percent.
