



## State BEARFACTS 1995 – 2005

### New Hampshire

The population of New Hampshire in 2005 was 1,303,112. Its rank was 41st in the nation.

#### PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2005 New Hampshire had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$37,352. This PCPI ranked 10th in the United States and was 108 percent of the national average, \$34,650. The 2005 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.4 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 national change was 4.6 percent. In 1995 the PCPI of New Hampshire was \$24,748 and ranked 10th in the United States. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.1 percent.

#### TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2005 New Hampshire had a total personal income (TPI) of \$48,673,618\*. This TPI ranked 38th in the United States. In 1995 the TPI of New Hampshire was \$28,647,435\* and ranked 40th in the United States. The 2005 TPI reflected an increase of 3.1 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 national change was 5.6 percent. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.3 percent.

#### COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and total personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of New Hampshire. In 2005 net earnings accounted for 74.9 percent of TPI (compared with 69.5 in 1995); dividends, interest, and rent were 13.2 percent (compared with 17.9 in 1995); and personal current transfer receipts were 11.9 percent (compared with 12.6 in 1995). From 2004 to 2005 net earnings increased 4.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 4.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.1 percent. From 1995 to 2005 net earnings increased on average 6.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.8 percent.

#### EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in New Hampshire increased from \$34,822,353\* in 2004 to \$36,557,702\* in 2005, an increase of 5.0 percent. The 2004-2005 national change was 5.3 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1995 estimate of \$19,673,164\* to the 2005 estimate was 6.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.5 percent.

*\*Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
