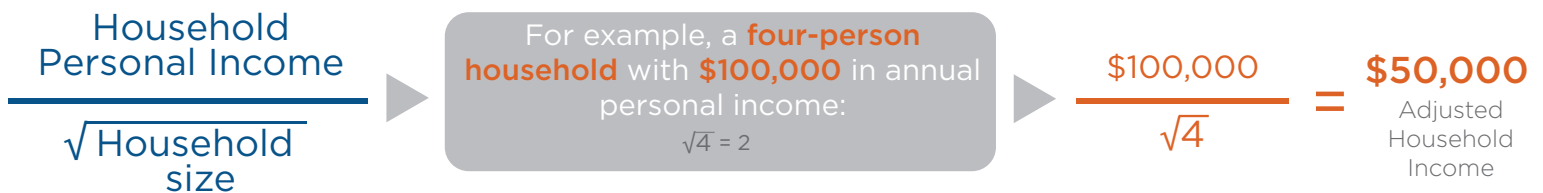


## Other Transfers (net)

To measure the **distribution of personal income**, BEA begins with people's incomes from all sources and adjusts for households of differing sizes.

## How Are Incomes Adjusted for Household Size?



### Where Do Adjusted Incomes Fall in the Quintiles?

Bottom 20%	20%-40%	40%-60%	60%-80%	80%-100%
